A visit to Waterford, Ireland's oldest city, has been arranged for Saturday 14th May 2016. Waterford's treasures are numerous. We will be met at the railway station by Mr Eamonn McEneaney, Director, Waterford Museums and FNCI Council Member, from where we will start our walking tour through the city, past the Quaker Meeting House, Chamber of Commerce Building and Roman Catholic Cathedral on the way to lunch (with wine) in a local restaurant. After lunch we will visit the Cathedral Quarter and Christchurch Cathedral and in the Viking Triangle we will visit Reginald's Tower, the Medieval Museum and the Bishop's Palace. We will end the tour with tea and coffee in the tearooms of the palace.
